Wine Storage

One of wine's most appealing traits — its ever-changing character — greatly influences its ultimate quality. From the time the grapes are picked to the moment a wine is served, the color, bouquet and flavor of a wine are determined by its skillful handling and storage.

Dealing with a reputable merchant or importer helps assure the wines you acquire arrive to you in good condition. But once in your home, only careful attention allows a fine wine to develop properly. (Even wines which you intend to drink almost immediately benefit from proper handling and storage.)

KitchenAid has designed the temperature-controlled Wine Cellar refrigerated wine storage system to create the optimum conditions for your home wine collection. To allow your wines to age properly during storage, we have noted some important handling considerations in this guide. Followed carefully as you use your new wine cellar, they can help you get the most enjoyment from the wines you collect.

1. Proper Bottle Positioning

Horizontal storage keeps the wine in contact with the cork so that the cork remains moist, fully swollen and airtight. (Upright storage, over time, will dry and shrink the cork, enabling air to enter the bottle and prematurely age the wine.)

2. Proper Temperature

Cool, consistent temperatures let fine wines age gracefully. Overchilling in an ordinary refrigerator can affect a wine's flavor and aroma — and make the cork difficult to remove. Furthermore, certain full-bodied wines are enhanced when only lightly chilled, while sparkling wines will taste more crisp and fresh if chilled to a greater degree.

As a rule of thumb, the lighter the wine, the cooler it should be stored. Champagnes do best when stored at approximately 45° F; white wines at 50° F to 55° F; and red wines at 60° F to 65° F.

4. Stability


Part of the enjoyment of wine collecting is being able to showcase your collection. However, wines do best when they are allowed to rest undisturbed without agitation. To protect the quality of your wines, store your collection where visitors can easily view the bottles without handling them.

The practice of "turning" stored bottles should also be avoided. Many people are of the impression that "turning" helps the wine develop properly, when in fact this practice can stir up sediment inside the bottle or cause the cork to loosen. (True connoisseurs aim to keep a bottle of wine undisturbed until just before they are ready to serve it.)

5. The Impact of Light

Wines do not need to be stored in darkness; however, the warmth from both artificial light and sunlight over time can affect the quality of wine. It is best to store bottles away from direct sunlight or other heat sources and to avoid exposing them to artificial light for extended periods of time. The glass door on your KitchenAid Wine Cellar is tinted to help protect your wine collection.


Features



Operation

Proper operation is important if you seek to get the best possible results from your wine cellar.

1. Setting the Temperature Control



The temperature control knob is located in the middle of the base grille.

The control is factory set at the midpoint setting: "4-1/2." When the wine cellar is installed in a room with a 72° F ambient temperature, this setting will provide the recommended temperature range.

Factors which may affect the internal temperatures of the system include:

- The room temperature.
- The number of times the door is opened and closed.
- The amount of time the display light is illuminated. (This affects primarily wines on the top racks.)
- Whether the system is installed in direct sunlight or near a heat source.

For a warmer setting, turn the control counterclockwise to a lower number.


For a cooler setting, turn the control clockwise to a higher number.

2. Stocking Recommendations

The TriZone[™] cooling system is designed to provide three different temperature zones within the cabinet. Store sparkling wines on the bottom, white wines on the middle racks and red wine on the upper racks. The system will hold up to sixty, 750ml bottles of wine. (Nine bottles on each full shelf; six bottles on the bottom shelf.)

Tip: To easily identify bottles without disturbing them, store bottles label side up.



Stocking procedure: Starting at the left-hand side of the shelf, place the first bottle on the rear and middle parallel braces of the rack with the neck of the bottle facing forward. Place the next bottle on the front and middle parallel braces with the neck facing rear. Continue to alternate the bottles is this manner, moving left to right, until the shelf is full. Use the same procedure for the remaining shelves. Bottles at the bottlem of the cabinet should be stocked crosswise.

3. Locking the Cabinet

A door lock is located in the middle upper portion of the door. Additional keys may be ordered from your dealer.

4. Lighting the Cabinet

An interior light will come on when the door is opened. To have the light remain on while the door is closed, press the switch below the temperature control knob. (Note: Leaving the light on for an extended period of time will slightly increase the cabinet temperature.)

Care and Cleaning

A WARNING



Electrical Shock Hazard

Disconnect from electrical supply before replacing light bulb or cleaning the condenser coil.

Failure to follow this instruction could result in death or electrical shock.

1. Bulb Replacement

Replacement light bulbs. Part No. 4344602, are available from your dealer.

- Disconnect the power supply cord.
- Using a Phillips screwdriver, remove the 4 light shield screws. Replace bulb.
- Reinstall the light shield and plug in power supply cord.

2. Cleaning the Interior and Exterior

Interior: Clean with mild soap and water. Wipe with clear water. (Do not use solvent cleaning agents, abrasives or cleaners.) Wine racks lift up for cleaning cabinet walls. If desired, remove wine racks for cleaning by unscrewing lock tabs at rear of racks. Check that lock tabs are properly secured with screws when racks are reinstalled and that upright rear brace does not touch the evaporator at cabinet rear.

Exterior: Clean with mild cleaners or mild soap and water.

Glass Door: Clean with glass cleaner or mild soap and water. Do not use abrasives.

3. Condenser

Do not touch the sharp condenser fins.

Clean the condenser coil (behind the base grille) 2 to 3 times per year.

- Put on protective gloves.
- Pull control knob to remove.
- Use a 7/32" nut driver or ratchet to remove the middle screw next to control knob.
- Grasp the grille with both hands and pull it up and forward to remove.
- Clean the condenser coil using a brush or vacuum cleaner.
- Align two tabs on bottom of grille with wine cellar base. Carefully push grille straight in and down until screw hole on grille aligns with base screw hole.
- Reattach grille with screw.
- Align the openings in control knob with rods on wine cellar base. Push control knob into place. Do Not force the control knob.
